

Step 3: Legalities and How to Apply for Homeschooling

Homeschooling Laws in Western Australia

Homeschooling in WA is regulated under the School Education Act 1999, which requires parents to register their child for homeschooling once they reach compulsory school age (turning 6 by June 30 of the relevant year). Parents are legally required to provide an educational program that meets the learning needs of their child and aligns with WA educational standards.

Key Legal Requirements:

1. **Registration:**
 - Parents must apply for registration with the WA Department of Education.
 - The child must be registered before they are due to start compulsory schooling.
 - A moderator will be assigned to oversee compliance.
2. **Education Program:**
 - Parents must develop and implement an education plan tailored to the child's needs.
 - The program should demonstrate progress across core learning areas.
 - Flexibility is allowed to accommodate individual learning styles.
3. **Annual Reviews:**
 - An appointed Department of Education moderator will review the progress annually.
 - Parents must provide evidence of learning, such as portfolios, work samples, and progress reports.

How to Apply for Homeschooling in WA

Follow these steps to register for homeschooling in WA:

1. **Download the Application Form:**

 - Once approved, a moderator will contact Arlie to schedule an initial assessment visit.
 - During the visit, the education plan will be reviewed and suggestions may be provided.
