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Setting Up Record-Keeping Systems

In WA, homeschooling parents must demonstrate that their child is making educational progress in line with their learning plan. Good record-keeping ensures compliance and allows for easy review during moderator visits.

What to Record:

1. **Learning Progress:**
 - Daily or weekly logs of activities and subjects covered.
 - Photos of completed projects and activities.
 - Samples of Kove's work, such as worksheets, drawings, or written assignments.
 2. **Assessment and Developmental Goals:**
 - Notes on Kove's achievements and milestones reached.
 - Areas where additional support may be needed.
 - Progress reports prepared every few months to track growth.
 3. **Therapy Integration:**
 - Records of therapy sessions attended and progress made.
 - Recommendations from therapists incorporated into the learning plan.
 4. **Socialisation Activities:**
 - Documentation of playgroups, community outings, and social interactions.
 - Photos or brief summaries of interactions with peers.
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Record-Keeping Methods:
